




10 HABITS OF SUCCESSFUL STUDENTS

DIGITAL STEGAOGRAPHY

With the progression of the dig.italage, digital stegaography has become .more practical and powerful as data is the soul of computer communication. The digital information revolution has brought about profound changes in day-to-day life. Due to the increase in exchange of data over the computer network, the security of data has become major concern and so the confidentiality and data integrity are required for protecting against unauthorized access and use. This has resulted in an explosive growth of the field of information hiding. The attacks on information systems; cyber-security and cyber-forensics have become a primary concern for both Governments and commercial industries. For many years, data hiding have captured the attention of designers, developers and evaluators of for processing sensitive information and to establish covert channels in order to concern sensitive information. Data hiding is a method of hiding secret data in to a digital medium so that the hidden data are imperceptible to everyone



except the intended recipient. There is global interest in steganography technology, research and development has exploded in recent years. This is because of the potential of digital steganography to establish covert channels for communications. With digital steganography, it is possible to hide information inside a digital file without causing perceptual degradation. It could be done by embedding information inside a file through a technique manipulate or modifies the unused bits of digital media and such modification is not visible. Sub sequently, the receiver to whom the message is delivered can also extract the hidden information from the cover media. Steganegraphy provides the capability to hide the confidential data, hardness of detecting the hidden data and strengthening of the secrecy of the hidden data. Methods of steganography have existed for centuries, althoughwith the advent of digital technology; have taken on a new form. Steganography has a wide range of applications mainly in the sect1rity of the digital data. They are also getting attentions. Because of self awareness to increase security system and also after the world wide security attack. Research including data inside image file using steganography technique is a topic of great interest. Given the proliferation of digital image and given the high degree of redundancy present in its binary representation, there has been an increased interest in using images as cover-objects for the purpose of steganography.

- In case you're contemplating beginning a business, attempt to address a few business people in your condition. Get some information about what they do on a normal day.




INTRODUCTION TO INTERNET OF THINGS

Internet of Things (IOT) is a hot topic, on which lot of research work, specially in India is in progress. An internet connection is a wonderful thing; It gives us all sort of benefits that just were not possible before. Think of cell-phone before it was a smart-phone. We could call and could text only, but now we can read any book, watch any movie, or listen to any song all in the palm of our hand. The Internet of Things is about extending the power of the internet beyond computers and smart-phones to a whole range of other things, processes and environments. IoT is simply the network of interconnected things/devices which are embedded with sensors, software, network connectivity and necessary electronics that enables them to collect and exchange data making them responsive.

How IT works?

An IT ecosystem consists of web-enabled smart devices that use embedded processors, sensors and communication hardware to collect, send and act on data they acquire from their environments. IOT devices share the sensor data they collect by connecting to an IoT gateway or other edge device where data is either sent to the cloud to be analysed or analysed locally.

Sometimes, these devices communicate with other related devices and act on the information they get from one another. The devices do most of the work without human intervention, although people can interact with the devices — for instance, to set them up, give them instructions or access the data. The connectivity, networking and communication protocols used with these web-enabled devices largely depend on the specific IoT applications deployed. Internet of Things, all the things that are being connected to the internet can be put into three categories:



This means sensors. Sensors could be temperature sensors, motion sensors, moisture sensors, air quality sensors, light sensors, you name it. These sensors, along with a connection, allow us to automatically collect information from the environment which, in turn, allows us to make more intelligent decisions. On the farm, automatically getting information about the soil moisture can tell farmers exactly when their crops need to be watered. Instead of watering too much (which can be an expensive over-use of irrigation systems and environmentally wasteful) or watering too little (which can be an expensive loss of crops), the farmer can ensure that crops get exactly the right amount of water.

2. Receiving and Acting on Information

We're all very familiar with machines getting information and then acting. Our printer receives a document and it prints it. Our car receives a signal from your car keys and the doors open. The examples are endless he real power of the Internet of Things arises when things can do both of above.

3. Doing Both

Let's quickly go back to the farming example. The sensors can collect information about the soil moisture to tell the farmer how much to water the crops, the irrigation system can automatically turn on as needed, based on how much moisture is in the soil. We can take it a step further too. If the irrigation system receives information about the weather from its internet connection, it can also know when it's going to rain and decide not to water the crops today because they'll be watered by the rain anyways.

Smart Home

With IoT creating the buzz, 'Smart Home' is the most searched IoT associated feature on Google. But what is a Smart Home? Wouldn't you love if you could switch on air conditioning before reaching home or switch off lights even after you have left home? Or unlock the doors to friends for temporary access even when you are not at home. Don't be surprised with IoT taking shape companies are building products to make your life simpler and convenient. Smart Home has become the revolutionary ladder of success in the residential spaces and it is predicted Smart homes will become as common as smart-phones.

2. Wearable

Wearable have experienced a explosive demand in markets all over the world. Companies like Google, Samsung have invested heavily in building such devices. But, how do they work? Wearable devices are installed with sensors and software which collect data and information about the users. This data is later pre-processed to extract essential insights about user. TECHNICAL COMMUNICATION AND ITS IMPORTANCE FOR ENGINEERS



Technical communication is also a type of communication that has a specific purpose with a well-defined audience. Technical communication has to be correct, accurate, clear, appropriate, and to the point. The language should be clear and easily understandable.

One of the chief objectives of Technical Communication is to provide organized information that aids in quick decision-making. "A report or paper must be written. Anyone engaged in scientific work who is incapable of making this kind of report is not a scientist but a technician, not an engineer, but a mechanic. Proficiency in his written and spoken dialect is a badge which cannot be counterfeit".



Now the question is what skills do engineers need most to be successful in their jobs? A lot of research studies have come to the conclusion that communication skills are extremely important for engineers.

Studies conducted at Ohio State University, Purdue University, and the New Jersey Institute of Technology have arrived at this finding that problem solving is considered to be the most important skill, but secondary to that are teamwork, communication (oral and written), and management skills.

According to Lang, James, Cruse McVey & McMasters (1999) engineering is a rapidly changing field requiring a broader set of skills than was once thought necessary in the engineer's college education.

Engineering work is highly dependent upon communication skills. Engineers must be able to report their ideas and designs clearly and succinctly to their subordinates, co-workers, supervisors, and clients.

The format of engineering communications can vary widely, from order placement letters to letters of enquiry, from technical proposals to summaries of calculations, from official technical memos to analytical reports, from product instructions (manuals) to power-point presentations.

By sound technical communication skills, a person utilizes various visual aids like tables, graphs, charts, drawings, diagrams, photographs and maps in their reports and presentations. And a well-designed professionally generated presentation has the capability of increasing audience interest and also to increase the impact of message. It also helps the listeners to retain information and the speakers to present ideas without depending on any paper notes. In the present era the field of technologists needs skilled communicators.


They need to have the ability to listen, understand, distill, and further communicate information. Effective communication skill is an important life skill required not only in one's academic and professional career but also in one's personal career. And in this process along with linguistic features paralinguistic features also play a key role.

The actual challenge before the Engineering students starts when they cross the threshold of the college and enter their professional life. In this process they have to go through various entrance tests and interviews. Verbal ability forms a major portion of these tests.




